

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. If anyone does not remain in me, he is like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned.

John 15:1-6

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Review

The setting is Maundy Thursday. Jesus has washed his disciples' feet, given them the new covenant (love one another). Judas has left them, so the faithful, dear 11 are with Jesus. In a matter of hours, he'll be in the Garden of Gethsemane.

1. In these verses, Jesus pictures his relationship with his disciples. Identify:

Vine: Jesus

Branch: *Us*

Fruit: God-pleasing acts, evidences of our Christian faith

Gardener: God

2. Does an adjective jump out at you in verse 1?

True...Jesus is the "real" & only vine that matters. There are certainly many vines that people connect themselves to. Such as?

3. Scan the verses above for yourself. Underline or note repetition of words.

[vine, branch, (fruit), REMAIN]

4. How do Christians remain in Jesus?

By staying connected...through study, prayer, etc.

5. What does it mean that Jesus remains in us?

He (the Holy Spirit) is in our heart – maintaining our faith, strengthening us, and insuring/assuring our eternal life.

6. Why can't we bear fruit without Christ?

In the John People's Bible, Gary Baumler says, "We need Jesus if we will do anything Godpleasing." (Romans 3:12, 7:18-19, 8:7-8)

7. Read 1 Peter 1:5-7. In real life, how does Jesus prune "every branch that does bear fruit"? trials...why? So our faith may be refined...may result in praise, glory & honor to God

Prayer

Joyful Reminders

Read Romans 11:18: ¹⁸do not boast over those branches. If you do, consider this: You do not support the root, but the root supports you.

It's not our responsibility to "hold up" God and his ministry...

18. What is the comfort in this verse?

It's the other way around...He is there to support us and others.

Read John 15:7-11: If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be given you. ⁸This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. ⁹"As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in his love. ¹¹I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.

19. What great privilege does Jesus say belongs to those who remain in Christ? Whatever we ask for will be given to us.

20. In light of the context of this verse, what might be some things we should ask for? *Help in remaining in the Lord and bearing fruit.*

21. How does our bearing fruit glorify the Father?

It's a witness to His great love for us...

22. How has the Father loved Jesus?

By supporting Jesus and sending the Holy Spirit to work in the hearts of so many...

23. How has Jesus loved us?

The greatest demonstration of love...exactly what he would do the next day! The final verse is so refreshing: Why does Jesus give these directives? Read verse 11 a loud as a group.
